If you are providing your own costume & would like to keep the items, please be sure to label them accordingly. [PLEASE LABEL YOUR SHOES!]

Costume items needed:

FOR ORPHANS & ENSEMBLE GIRLS:

- Flannel nightgowns; light colors, small prints nothing bright or colorful
- Dresses in sizes 6-14; Bland/drab/faded/colorless (but not white)
- Oversize cardigan sweaters, bland colors
- Lace up boots; brown or black (should look warn, not shiney)
- Petticoats

ENSEMBLE BOYS:

- Tan or brown pants
- Bland button down shirt; long or short sleeve; preferably light pattern, no pinks or bright white
- Cardigan sweater or oversized coat
- Brown shoes with laces or penny loafers

"HOOVERVILLE-ITES":

- oversized dresses; low-waisted, drab colors/warn looking, buttons, collared
- men>Tan or brown pants
- Bland button down shirt; long or short sleeve; preferably light pattern, no pinks or bright white
- oversized cardigan sweaters; can have holes; drab colors
- overcoats; winter (remember 1933)
- winter hats; fingerless gloves; scarves(1933)

SHOES:

- All Principle Women including Dancing maids, Boylan Sisters, Lily, Grace, etc. need CHARACTER SHOES
- Ensemble Women: Lace up boots; brown or black (should be warn, not shiney) OR character shoes
- Men: Penny loafers or laced dress shoes (black or brown)
